




Note From the Director

Note From the Director

I am so thankful to be given the opportunity to direct such an impactful piece written by a phenomenal playwright. These are important stories. The present horrors of our youth's realities need to be shared. When we took this play to the reading at Phoenix Theater, one of the patrons in the audience remarked how, this is a today's problem and something they had not experienced when they were in school over 20 years ago.

When I was in elementary school, I would be so scared for the first week of school. And I loved being at school! I was terrified because I knew the first week of school was always the week we would go over our lockdown protocols, and I would have nightmares for days leading up to it about what I would do in that kind of scenario and I would have nightmares for days afterward. I didn't want to even think about enduring the protocols, let alone going through them. Today's kids have protocols at least once a month. I cannot imagine the anxiety I would have had if I were in elementary school today and enduring even the thought of preparing for these real-world disasters. This play is a love story for teachers everywhere, they are the real knights of modern day. Thank you to all educators everywhere.

In 2023, there were over 604 mass shootings, of those, over 340 were school shootings. This is a today problem and a growing problem. We need to take action now to prevent this from growing. Please look into your state's gun laws, vote and make your voice heard to enact legislation that will place safer restrictions on gun control.

Note From the Director


