About Hadestown Teen Edition

Time, Place & Setting

Hadestown is a mythic tale - not set in a particular time or place - but it does take inspiration from the american depression era and the city of New Orleans. It consists of two worlds: most of Act One takes place aboveground, and most of Act Two takes place in the underworld (Hadestown). Occasionally, both worlds are visible at once.

Runtime & Intermission

Hadestown Teen Edition runs approximately 150 minutes (2 ½ hours) with a 15-minute intermission.



Note From the Directors of Hadestown Teen Edition

In April of 2024, my wife Falin and I took a trip to New York City. This would be my first time ever visiting New York, and my first time ever seeing a show on Broadway. We were only able to fit one show in our itinerary, so we asked our friends and colleagues what we should see. The answer we received far more than any other, was *Hadestown*. We purchased ridiculously expensive seats at the box office for a Wednesday matinee on April 17th, which just so happened to be *Hadestown's* 5 year anniversary on Broadway. The show was absolutely beautiful. I couldn't have asked for a better experience for my first ever Broadway show. Immediately after Falin and I left the theatre, I told her "I need to direct this show."

Hadestown opened on Broadway in 2019, and in just five short years has cemented its place in Broadway history. It was nominated for 14 Tony Awards in 2019 and won eight of them including Best Musical, and has even won a Grammy for Best Musical Theatre Album. To me, the iconography of Hadestown is on the same level of Hamilton or A Chorus Line. The seedy jazz club in Depression Era New Orleans, the sprawling industrial walls of Hadestown, the hand holding the red flower; images that will be part of Broadway history forever.

Most of all, the messages within the music and lyrics of *Hadestown* resonated with me. I won't spell everything out for you here because that would be stupid and annoying of me, but I will share some notes that I think are important. Above all, the message of Hadestown can be summed up in the song "If It's True" sung near the middle of Act II. I've written and deleted several long paragraphs explaining the restrictive contracts we had to sign to do this production, but I'll just say this: a show where the protagonist saves the day with his extraordinary artistic abilities, and proves that the people should be free from the clutches of an oppressive oligarchy should probably not have this many restrictions on advertising and creative liberties. The themes of *Hadestown* are more important now than ever before. Corporate greed is the one of the greatest evils humanity is facing right now, and it's really disheartening to see Hadestown falling victim to the very thing it actively warns against.

Something that eagle-eyed super fans of *Hadestown* may notice is different about our production is that the flower that appears after Orpheus sings his song is a rose. The flower used on Broadway (seen in the iconic playbill and album cover) is heavily debated whether it is intended to be a carnation, pomegranate (a nod to the original tale of O & E), or ranunculus flower. I decided to use a rose for a number of reasons, but the easiest answer is because a rose is a universal symbol of love, even in Greek mythology. If that's not a good enough reason for you, I would suggest looking into the French Socialist movement in 1969.

If you're still reading, now is the part where I thank everyone who made this show possible. I am beyond grateful to Kenny for trusting me to direct this production, and am honored to have been able to work alongside this unbelievably talented production team. Many thanks to Sam, Angel, Rob, Ellie, Caster and Nevaeh for their wonderful designs and enthusiasm. I'd also like to extend thanks to Elise, Maria, Ada and Marai, and many, many thanks to every single member of this ridiculously talented and intelligent cast for putting in the work to bring these beautiful characters to life. Finally, thank you to my amazing wife Falin for listening to my ramblings about *Hadestown*, and for putting her heart and soul into choreographing these insane dance numbers (while pregnant)!








Jaely Damasco

Eli Franklin Hades



Janaysha Garcia


Hermes

Joey Garcia Worker



Morgan Massey



WHAT TO KNOW ABOUT GREEK MYTHOLOGY BEFORE SEEING HADESTOWN TEEN EDITION

Anaïs Mitchell first envisioned *Hadestown* as a concept album inspired by Greek mythology before expanding it into a musical.

The story combines the myths of Orpheus and Eurydice with Hades and Persephone, reimagining them in a gritty, industrial setting scored with jazz and folk music. Mitchell's version uses these timeless tales to explore themes like greed, exploitation, and love's resilience.

Although *Hadestown* diverges from its mythological roots geographically and thematically, the characters' arcs and personalities remain tied to ancient Greek literature.

Greek Myths in Hadestown

The musical adapts two classic stories of love and hearthreak:

Orpheus and Eurydice:

Orpheus, a gifted musician, marries Eurydice, a wood nymph. Their happiness is short-lived when Eurydice dies from a snake bite. Heartbroken, Orpheus journeys to the underworld to plead for her return. Hades agrees but sets a condition: Orpheus must

not look back at Eurydice as they ascend. Just before reaching the surface, he looks back, and Eurydice is lost forever. In Hadestown, Orpheus is a poor musician, and Eurydice willingly enters Hadestown, not knowing its true nature.

Hades and Persephone:

In mythology, Hades abducts Persephone to be his bride in the underworld. Her mother, Demeter, negotiates a compromise: Persephone spends part of the year above ground, representing spring and summer, and the rest with Hades, symbolizing autumn and winter. In Hadestown, Hades builds his underground empire to keep Persephone close, but she feels trapped, mirroring their mythic tension.

Key Characters in Hadestown

- Orpheus: A demigod in mythology known for his enchanting music, reimagined in Hadestown as a struggling musician.
- Eurydice: A wood nymph in the myths, portrayed as a lonely, impoverished young woman who chooses to enter Hadestown.
- Hades: The god of the underworld, here a ruthless industrial tycoon.
- Persephone: Goddess of agriculture, unhappy in her role as queen of Hadestown.
- Hermes: The messenger god and narrator, who also acts as Orpheus's mentor.



• The Fates: The trio who control destiny, influencing but not dictating events in Hadestown.


Major Adaptations in Hadestown

- Setting: The mystical Greek world becomes a harsh, industrialized Earth. The underworld is
 reimagined as Hadestown, an exploitative factory reached via a railroad called the "road to hell."
- Characters: Gods are humanized. Hades is more like a power-hungry billionaire, and Orpheus and Eurydice are portrayed as struggling individuals.
- Themes and Tone: The dead of Greek mythology become an oppressed labor force. Persephone runs a speakeasy for them, providing a brief escape from Hades' control.
- Music: Instead of ancient tunes, the story is told through contemporary folk and jazz.


