

Summary: Our story takes place in the mid-1980's at the Hotel Messina in Georgia.



To fill in the time until the wedding, Don Pedro and the others set about tricking Benedick and Beatrice into falling in love with each other. Meanwhile, Don Pedro's disgruntled half-sister, D.J., and her followers, plot to ruin Hero and halt her wedding. Claudio believes D.J.'s deception and is convinced Hero has a lover. At the wedding, Claudio brutally rejects her.


With Hero in hiding and falsely reported dead, Beatrice persuades Benedick to fight Claudio. Tragedy is averted when the bumbling Neighborhood Watch of the Girl Scout Troop 30819 discover D.J.'s treachery, arrive at the hotel and clear Hero's name.


With Claudio forgiven, both couples are ready to get married.








Note From the Director of Much Ado About Nothing

Much of this play revolves around writing secret messages, spying, and eavesdropping. People are constantly pretending to be others or being mistaken for other people, and are constantly tricked in one way or another. Intriguingly, much of the play's action hinges upon the word. In Shakespeare's time, "noting" (meaning gossip, rumor, and overhearing) was pronounced very similarly to "nothing", and "noting" is what tricks the two main characters, Benedick and Beatrice, to confess their love for each other.

Shakespeare was a master of words — there's a reason why he's considered the best English writer of all time. The level of depth and the different layers of meaning he gives to an apparently simple title just goes to show how amazing he was at this craft, and why he still fascinates us to this very day, more than four centuries after his plays were written. It also suggests that he liked dirty jokes, but that's another story.


One of the actors said the other day, "It doesn't feel like we're doing Shakespeare, it's so whacky." I love that. I feel that all young actors should perform Shakespeare.

I loved when I made the suggestion to have an actual stream on the stage with real running water, without missing a beat, Rob said, "Sure, where do you want it?" Then of course when I mentioned I wanted to put real fish in it, my wife, Maria and everyone else yelled at me... "NO!"

A giant thank you to Maria, the cast, crew, and designers for working hard and loving, doing Shakespeare. We had a fun time creating this version of the show.


William Richardson Claudio



Josh Hontz (Composer)



Anthony Rozzen (Lighting & Sound Designer)


